TAKE A SCAVENGER HUNT – Look for the play of light

- After looking at the resources for ideas. Take a scavenger hunt of sorts looking for examples. Literally --Go for a walk mid day in the harsh sun and look around you, this will give you great shadows!
- Go inside and play with the window light, and side light.
- As the sun sets / rises go outside and try to create a silhouette by placing an object in front of the sun or any light source. Work with low light and a flash light or candle. Download a long exposure setting or app and use moving lights

TECHNIQUES to use with Light-

- 1. Side light
- 2. Back Light or Silouhette
- 3. Shadows
- 4. Low light. Experimental lights. Try long exposure setting or app.

Photo Tips:

- Move around your subject.
- Try a low angle or high angle to view it.
- Simplify what we see and make a point with your photo, watch for background distractions.
- Zoom in OR put subject off center
- Use touch screen to control exposure and focus
- Don't use filters on photos
